They have used all of their skills from English and Maths which they have learnt through the years and put it all into practice as part of their vocational learning experience. I cannot put into words how hard all 3 groups have worked this term, well done.

As usual this has been a very busy term for Phase 4 and with the improving weather has come more access to the local community for all class groups.

Upnor Class have continued to learn to use public transport to access local towns and their facilities such as public libraries.

Canterbury Class have visited the Café and the Co-op in New Ash Green and Bluewater, where students have been learning about sharing, using money and waiting their turn whilst developing their communication skills.

Dover Class have also been accessing the local Co-op to purchase ingredients for the egg based dishes they have made this term, with quiche and scotch eggs both being interesting for the students to make.

Rochester Class has had a busy and exciting term, including an excellent trip via public transport to Chislehurst Caves. Six students took part in the Wilmington Academy/Milestone Academy Science Fiction Competition, winning medals in all categories entered.
