

## **What are EHCPs?**

Under the new SEN Code it is a requirement for Statements of Educational Need to be transferred into Education, Health and Care Plans (EHCPs). This basically means transferring the information from your child's Statement onto the new EHCP, whilst considering provision for their identified needs.

## **What will happen?**

Our letter of 22.09.14 ([Click here for a copy](#)) gives more information on the process. All parents/carers have been sent an appointment for a 20 minute pre-meeting with their child's class teacher. You will be notified of your transfer meeting in due course (which will last approximately an hour).

## **What will the EHCP look like?**

Some people have asked for more information on how the new EHCP will look. The draft template that Kent will be using for EHCPs is available [here](#).

A brief summary of how the sections will look is below:

### **Section A: Views & Aspirations of Child**

Forms are being completed in class at present with your child. They will then be sent home for you to see and comment over half term, and bring them back to your pre-meeting with your class teacher.

### **Section B Child or Young Person's needs**

In your child's statement this was Section 2. Their needs will be considered and grouped under the following areas:

- Communication and interaction
- Cognition and learning
- Social, emotional and mental health
- Sensory and/or physical
