The admission of children with Education, Health and Care Plans to schools is a matter for the Local Authority who has statutory responsibility for arranging their provision. There are admissions criteria for each special school that are applied in order to determine if a particular special school would be a suitable placement. SEND teams are responsible for fulfilling duties arising from the <u>Children and Families Act 2014</u> and the revised <u>SEND Code of Practice</u> and are responsible for creating and updating the relevant documents that support children and young people with SEND.

They also:

- oversee and coordinate applications for <u>education health and care (EHC) needs</u>
 assessment requests
- let you know of the decisions made throughout the process
- support your family, child or young person through the process
- work to ensure your child or young person attends the correct education provider with the agreed support
- oversee the annual review process
- manage the paperwork for a child or young person moving in or out of the Kent area.
